The National Trust holds the majority of its land and buildings for the Nation in accordance with our Core Purpose, however a small part of our land is held as “investment land”. Fontwell Field forms part of the National Trust’s Slindon Estate but is held as investment land and the Trust is currently exploring options as to how this piece of land could potentially be developed . Should this land be developed the money would be returned to the Slindon Estate to fund projects for many years to come and enable the Trust to continue its valuable conservation work in this part of West Sussex. The Trust has produced 3 options and would very much welcome your feedback to enable us to develop the proposals.
