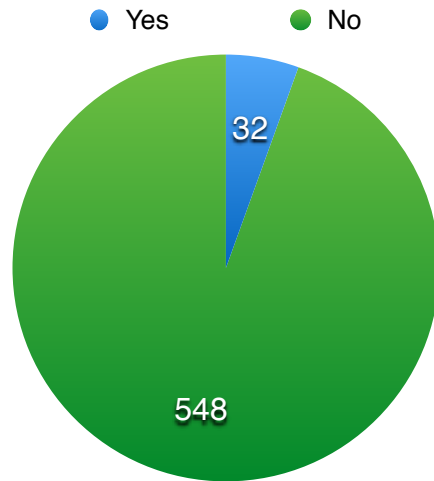
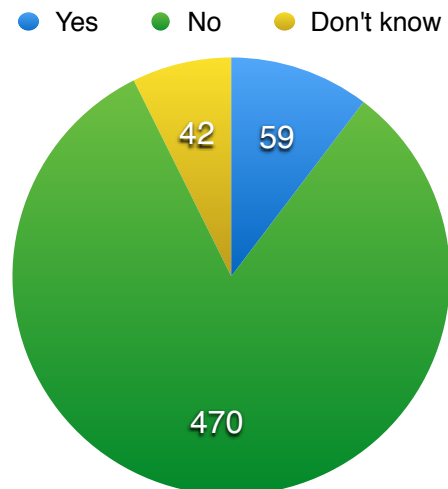


Housing Needs

Are there any adults living in your home who need, but currently cannot obtain, their own home in the villages?

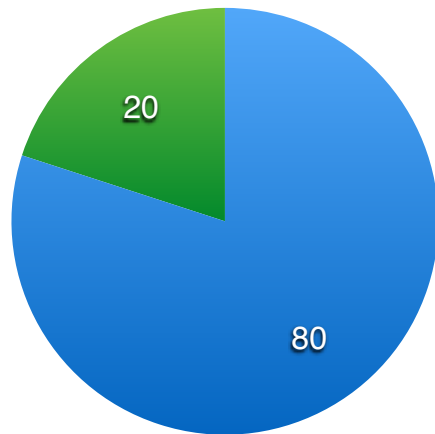


Is there anyone in your family who doesn't currently need their own home but is likely to want one in the Parish in the next 5 years?

Small property suitable for person with special needs and suitable for sharing Starter Home

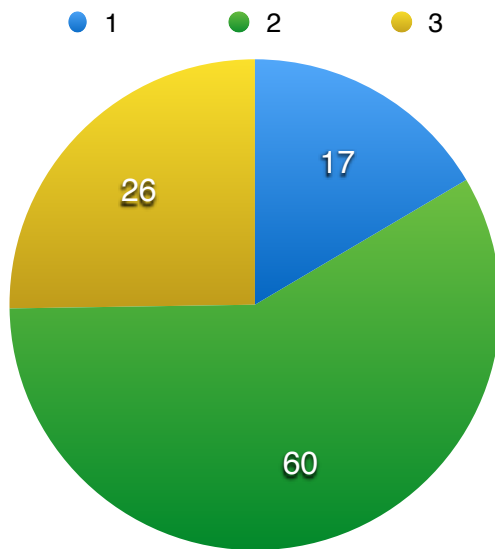

The village is in need of warden assisted flats

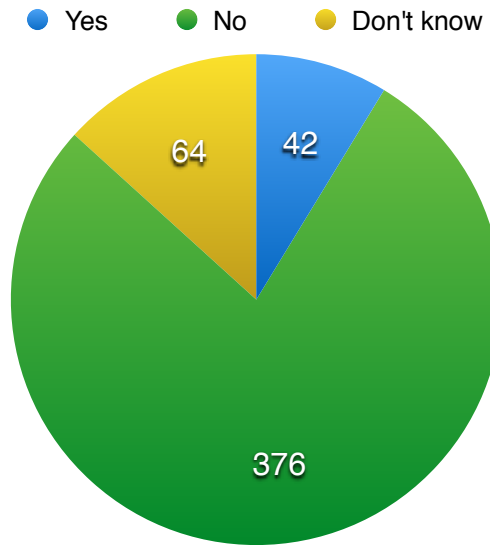
There is insufficient housing for youngsters and first time buyers prices are ridiculous and therefore effects the demographic make up of the villages-an aging population- youngsters leave.
